This scholarship is given in recognition of a student's character, demonstrated passion, and academic merit in an area of interest to the student (for example: sports, the arts, a community organization, or any other area that is meaningful to the student and in which their participation is notable). The Ulu Pono Scholarship provides up to 75% of annual tuition and is renewed each year of the student's Parker School career based upon upholding the school's missions and values, good citizenship, intellectual engagement, and academic standing and growth. This award is not given in addition to need-based financial aid, but in lieu of it.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to apply for the Ulu Pono Scholarship, students must complete the process to apply for admission to grades 6-8 at Parker School for the **2024-2025** school year. Additionally, students must have a good academic record and submit a financial aid application to Parker School.

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE ULU PONO SCHOLARSHIP - DEADLINE FEBRUARY 1, 2024

*All sections must be complete and submitted before midnight on this date. No exceptions to this deadline.

- 1. Complete all components of the admissions application process:
 - Follow procedures as detailed on the admissions procedures page of the school's website, www.parkerschoolhawaii.org
- 2. Submit a financial aid application.
 - The financial aid application is located on the school's website, parkerschoolhawaii.org
- 3. Complete the Ulu Pono Scholarship application:
 - The parent and student components of application should be completed and submitted to Parker School
 - The application form is available at the front desk in the main hall or may be downloaded at www.parkerschoolhawaii.org
- 4. Request a letter of academic recommendation:
 - Applicants should request a letter of recommendation from an academic teacher who is not related to the student
 - The letter should be submitted directly to Parker School by the recommender (you may provide the attached page and an addressed, stamped envelope to aid them in your request; see address below)
 - The letter should describe the academic merit and potential of the student, as well as the student's contribution to their learning community
 - Applicants should give the recommender ample time to complete and submit the letter.
- 5. Request a letter of personal recommendation:
 - Applicants should request a letter of personal recommendation from an additional adult (examples of a person able to provide such a recommendation would be a coach, instructor, or community leader)
 - The letter should be submitted directly to Parker School by the recommender (you may provide the attached page and an addressed, stamped envelope to aid them in your request, see address below)

- The letter should articulate the passion, commitment, potential, or accomplishment of the student in their given area of interest, or who can shed light on the character of the student
- Applicants should give the recommender ample time to complete and submit the letter.

6. Student interview:

- Scholarship finalists will be interviewed by a review committee after the submission deadline
- The admissions office will contact eligible applicants to schedule the interview
- 7. Applicants will be notified of the scholarship decision on the date of admission notification, March 8, 2024.
